I have found over the years that when I'm stuck in my writing, when I can't come up with a plot, when I can't get to the depth of a character, I default back to a fantasy novel. Mostly because I think fantasy and sci-fi has some of the smartest writing on the market, but also because I love the escape. I am continually amazed at the depth and breadth of imagination in this genre. There is everything you can possibly imagine out there, something for everyone. My dad, a huge sci-fi reader, prefers classic space stories. I particularly love stories of young heroines who are forced into roles of leadership.

Thinking of the early Sarah J. Maas, Leigh Bardugo, Holly Black, Julie Kagawa, Kendare Blake, Victoria Aveyard (I'm reading War Storm right now, actually)—all writers I turn to when I need a boost —many of these have the same themes to them: the reluctant hero who becomes the golden leader, the normal person who rises above an evil challenger to conquer and lead justly. Obviously, the Harry Potter novels are a favorite for just this reason.

I think the best modern example I could possibly give is The Hunger Games trilogy. I remember reading the first book and being completely blown away that this was considered young adult. But our young adult readers are incredibly sophisticated, always have been, and stories with morally challenging themes do well. What I wouldn't have given to have some of these books available when I was growing up...though I did okay. Ursula LeGuin, Mary Stewart, Anne

McCaffery, Marion Zimmer Bradley, and of course, Asimov, Tolkien, all the big hitters.

Our Jayne comes from lofty influences, that's for sure. And now, there is a whole new world before me, a vast and dizzying array of talented novelists who are tearing is it up with their incredibly feisty leads: our Alisha, and our R.L., Kerri Maniscalco, McKenzie Hunter, K.F. Breene, to name just a few. What an embarrassment of riches we have now. Tell me your favorites!


